A Season of Preparation, Anticipation and Expectations

By the time you receive this newsletter, we will be entering into Thanksgiving and the Advent season. During this time of the year, most people are happy, joyous, loving, thoughtful, considerate, affirming, excited, caring, generous, and much, much more. We are reminded of the blessings of having our families, friends, work to do, homes above our heads, our church, and above all our God who is the giver of all that is good. We are also mindful of people for whom this season is very difficult because of illness, loss, health issues, separation, loneliness, and difficulties and are in need of God's comforting presence.

Giving thanks will not change the circumstances of our lives, but it will change what our circumstances do to us. Thanksgiving will not remove the obstacles we face, the disappointments and losses we experience, but it will heal our spirit. God asks us for our thanksgiving whether we feel like making it or not - so that we might experience the blessings it brings to us and to others. "... in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." I Thessalonians 5:18. Look all around you will find that which is good, caring, kind, compassionate, healing, and forgiving and thank God for it and for the persons who are doing it. Remember, the true essence of Thanksgiving lies in cultivating an attitude of gratitude, fostering connections, and creating an atmosphere of love and appreciation.

Advent is the season that begins the liturgical year. It consists of four Sundays starting with the Sunday closest to November 30th. The word advent is derived from the Latin adventus, which means "coming" or "arrival." In the societies of the Roman empire, the word adventus referred to the arrival of a person of dignity and great power -- a king, emperor, or even one of the gods.

"Advent can only be celebrated only by those whose souls give them no peace, who know that they are poor and incomplete, and who sense something of the greatness that is supposed to come. The Holy one himself, God is the Christ child in the manger. God is coming, the Lord Jesus Christ is coming, Christmas is coming. Rejoice Oh Christians Rejoice." Dietrich Bonhoefer from *God Is In The Manger*.

How can we welcome Christ, how can we enter the promised land with him, how can we open a room in our hearts for him? John the Baptist came to prepare the way of the Lord by preparing the hearts of all who were willing to hear him. John called to the people to hear his message and to take action so that they would be able to greet the Messiah, and walk in his way. "Repent, and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins, he cried out, for after me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie."

Repent. What does the word repent mean? Quite simply it means to "turn around" to change direction, to face a new way, and to begin to walk on that way, leaving the old way behind. Let us also turn our direction toward Christ's forgiveness, love, grace, and peace. In the midst of the intersections of our fears and hopes, let this season indeed be for us a season of turning around, of making room, of preparation, and of anticipation, and of expectations.

God bless all who are near and dear to you, and may you and your loved ones find the very presence of our God who never leaves us nor forsakes us.
