

Upper Room Devotional

Psalm 29

Ascribe to the LORD, you heavenly beings, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the splendor of his holiness. The voice of the LORD is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the LORD thunders over the mighty waters. The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is majestic. The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars; the LORD breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon. He makes Lebanon leap like a calf, Sirion like a young wild ox. The voice of the LORD strikes with flashes of lightning. The voice of the LORD shakes the desert; the LORD shakes the Desert of Kadesh. The voice of the LORD twists the oaks and strips the forests bare. And in his temple all cry, "Glory!" The LORD sits enthroned over the flood; the LORD is enthroned as King forever. The LORD gives strength to his people; the LORD blesses his people with peace.

Reading Psalm 29 feels like the storm it describes. The phrases are short and punctuated with graphic imagery. Listening to the psalm, you can close your eyes and see the raging tempest that must have been bearing down on God's people. Perhaps they were calling out to God for help. But one thing is for sure: God's voice is powerful, and hearing it fills us with awe and inspires us to worship. Although God's voice can come as a whisper, this Psalm asserts that the voice of the Lord is never thwarted. It always achieves God's purposes. On this we can depend. It speaks to God's steadfast loving-kindness.

What has been your experience with water? Do you live near it and enjoy water-related recreational activities? Perhaps you've had scary experiences with water that make you wary. Whatever your experiences with literal water, we have all likely suffered from being tossed about by the metaphorical storms of life. During those times when noises surrounds us and the voice in our own head is yelling for help, it is reassuring that the God of the universe speaks to our needs and will bless us with strength and peace.

In Hebrew the word *strength* in verse 11 is a cognate for *security, might,* and *boldness*. In Exodus 15:2, strength is linked to salvation. Being blessed with strength in the context of this psalm means that we boldly find our security in God's might. Likewise the word *peace* or *shalom* carries with it the meanings of safety, healing, and wholeness. The psalm is telling us that God's love will not only secure us but will do so in such a way that we are made whole. God cares for us so that with God we will not only survive but thrive.

Dear Lord, in life's storms you offer us strength and safety. As the hymn says, "A mighty fortress is our God." Thank you for reaching out to us. Amen.
