The Wideness of God's Mercy

I enjoy reading Anne Lamott. I read *Plan B: Further Thoughts on Faith* which is a follow up to her first book on her conversion called *Travelling Mercies*, the book that made me admire her brutal honesty. She does not keep hidden thoughts from being published. I'm not sure how we would get along in person, because I represent a variety of views that she would find repulsive and even offensive. But the reason I like reading her essays raw with hatred for George Bush, right wing politics, and the occasional f-bomb is that it forces me to grapple with the wideness of God's mercy... for me.

As I said earlier there are no unwritten thoughts with Anne Lamott. Many of those thoughts are hilarious, many are touching, and some are downright offensive. But all are open for evaluation, scrutiny by the readers, and reproof and correction by the gospel. She honestly and humorously records the way the gospel demands her to love George Bush as a fellow Christian, flag-waving haired Republicans on a cruise ship, the woman who thoughtlessly left her dog's poop for Anne to step in, the man who abandoned her and her child, the perfectionistic mother who wounded her soul, her dread locks, her fifty year old body, and her anxiety-ridden self. Lamott's book is a book of confessions and no chapter fails to point and turn you to Christ.

Anne Lamott forces me to remember that all of my thoughts are spoken before God. While I would never have the courage to write them down as Lamott dares to do, they are permanently recorded in God's mind. My hateful, judgmental, coarse, covetous, thieving, conniving, manipulative, murderous, disrespectful, self-condemning, unbelieving thoughts are immediately before God even if they are never formed on my lips. And here is the scandalous truth—God loves me. God does not view me directly in terms of my thoughts—God views me through the record of Jesus Christ's life, death, and resurrection.

Lamott's book may not be for everyone. But anyone who has ever hated a parent or a politician, anyone who has ever had a panic attack over their teenager's future, anyone who has loathed self, a single mom angry at her situation, or anyone who hates ham and loves chocolate this book could be for you.

Her final reflections leave readers like me with a sense of hope, urging them to live authentically, maintain faith, and embrace resilience as they journey through the unpredictable landscape of existence. The following are few quotes from her book that you might find helpful. "We begin to find and become ourselves when we notice how we are already found, already held, and we learn to manage our damage."

"Almost everything will work again if you unplug it for a few minutes, including you."

"Life is significantly better when you are not consumed by anxiety."

"You can either practice being right or practice being kind."

"Hope begins in the dark, the stubborn hope that if you just show up and try to do the right thing, the dawn will come."


There is a wideness in God's mercy, like the wideness of the sea...wider even than...you name it.
