A Letter from Bishop Ruben Saenz, Jr. Leading After the Election

Dear members of the Horizon Texas Conference,

After an intense season that saw passionate debate and deep polarization leading to Election Day, the results have been announced, and Donald Trump has been elected as our next president. Whether this reflects the vote you cast or not, as your bishop, I call on all United Methodists in our conference to respond with grace, wisdom and a continued commitment to our shared Christian values.

On a day that will almost certainly see rhetoric about winner and losers, let us remember that our ultimate allegiance is to Christ, not to any political party or leader. As Paul reminds us in Philippians 3:20, "But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ." While we respect the office of the president and pray for our leaders, our primary focus must remain on living out the gospel in our communities.

In the coming days and weeks, I urge you to:

- 1. Pray for President-elect Trump, that he may lead with wisdom, compassion and a commitment to justice for all.
- 2. Reach out to those who may feel marginalized or fearful in light of this election result. Offer comfort, support and a listening ear.
- 3. Recommit to the United Methodist Social Principles, particularly our call to social justice, care for creation and the dignity of all persons.

As we navigate the presidential transition, let us be a beacon of hope and reconciliation in the face of division. As Jesus taught in Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.


