Christmas Does Not Have to Be Empty

Manger Square in Bethlehem on December 23, 2023, stood eerily empty. In most years, every inch of this space would be teeming with people, making it difficult to navigate through the crowds. However, last year, Christian Palestinians in solidarity with those in Gaza have made the heartbreaking decision to cancel the Christmas Celebration. Reflecting on the current state of affairs, a Lutheran pastor remarks, "If Jesus were born today, it might be amidst the rubble of Gaza."

Meanwhile, the horror and sorrow that gripped Israelis on October 7 continue to haunt the region. Families torn apart, children killed, women violated, and hostages enduring unspeakable torture - the anguish and trauma persist and widen.

Both Israelis and Palestinians deserve a better future. Yet, the deep-seated anger and mistrust accumulated over decades have now erupted into unimaginable violence. Political deceit, terrorism, and prejudice, largely fueled by falsehoods, are depriving all sides of viable solutions. The void is palpable, leaving no space for reason or compassion.

Deceit upon deceit has inflicted countless wounds on the souls of the people, rendering them incapable of mutual understanding, camaraderie, or love. The divisions have severed the rational mind from the instinctual, reducing life to a cycle of unending revenge.

As witnesses with heavy hearts and conflicting emotions, we find ourselves in a different kind of emptiness. Those who cherish relationships with both Jews and Palestinians are left in a desolate landscape of shattered hopes for a better world. We confront our own biases and prejudices, contemplating how we marginalize those we fear or overlook the plight of the homeless, the afflicted, or the immigrant seeking refuge.

We share a sense of emptiness that resonates with many this Christmas. The mangers of our souls may appear vacant, symbolizing the longing and searching for deeper meaning and connection amid the turmoil and despair.

Yet, we are also aware that the essence of Christmas is to refrain from despair, embrace hope, spread love, dwell in peace with neighbors, yourself, and with God.

O little town of Bethlehem how still we see thee lie, above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light, the hopes and fears of all the years are met with thee tonight. O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray, cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel.
