Administrative Board Meeting Summary February 16, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Mary Paris and George Angle gave the opening prayer.

George Angle gave a report on several issues concerning the church building:

- Winterizing the church building, getting estimates to re-strip the parking lot, having the carpets cleaned, lights fixed around the women's restroom by the choir room, red flame painted on the west side of the building, discussion to move trash dumpster, roof on resale shop, new pastor coming July 6, 2025, Pastor Mel moving out of parsonage March 1, having the Trustees going through the parsonage to see what needs to be done before new pastor arrives or making the decision to sell the parsonage. Dr. Martha Chapman seconded the motion and discussion followed. The motion passed.
- Mark Wright, our Endowment Consultant from Wells Fargo Bank presented a written report.
- Our District Superintendent, Rev. Philip Rhodes, addressed the group to discuss our future pastoral appointment. He asked for the qualities we need in our new pastor. He explained that we need to "Transmit the Faith" to everyone everywhere. We cannot reproduce our church from the past—we must build a new future for the present! We can't fall in love with the church—we must fall in love with Jesus. We should read the chapter of Acts again. Rev. Rhodes discussed our questions about housing, salary and accepting diversity in all areas of our church. He was very positive that St. Luke UMC has a great future. He stated that hiring a new youth director, Alvin Eclavea, is a wonderful step forward to address the need to get youth involved in the church and to build membership. The Staff Parish Relations Committee needs to meet with Rev. Rhodes in the next 10 days to continue the process of the pastor appointment. That meeting is scheduled for February 25.
- The meeting adjourned at 2:00 pm. These minutes were respectfully submitted by Mary Paris.
