St. Luke UMC welcomes new pastor, Rev. Todd Pick effective July 1

It is our joy to share with you that Bishop Ruben Saenz has appointed Rev. Todd Pick as the new pastor for our congregation. Pastor Todd will begin his new responsibilities on July 1 of this year. As a United Methodist Church, we are a part of an appointment system. Our congregation's Staff Parish Relations Committee has met with district superintendent Philip Rhodes to identify our congregation's needs and the needed skills in a pastor. They have also met with Pastor Todd to get to know him and to ask questions.

Rev. Todd Pick is an Elder in Horizon Texas Conference currently serving Revive UMC, a new church start in the Fort Worth area. Todd is a cradle United Methodist, and his parents were both music ministers who served on every committee possible in the life of the church. He grew up in the choir loft and learned the importance of singing our faith from childhood.

For the last 17 years, Todd has pastored congregations of all sizes and even worked on Conference staff here in Central Texas. He has learned that God is always doing new things and has witnessed the transformation of many local churches through ministries of preaching, teaching, consulting, and coaching.

Before entering the ministry, Todd was an award-winning graphic designer who worked in advertising on multiple Fortune 500 accounts including MasterCard, M&M Mars, and Hilton Hotels. He learned the importance of building collaborative teams that work creatively to meet goals. Feeling a calling to ordained ministry, he then attended Drew Theological School where he was artist-in-residence. Todd later returned to Drew to teach as adjunct faculty, and more recently received a grant to pair the arts with local church ministries. While at Drew, he met Jennifer—a native of Red Oak, Texas—and they have been partners in life and ministry for the last 15 years.

Todd has created stage visuals and planned worship for various United Methodist conferences across the country including General Conference 2012 and 2016. He has crafted meaningful liturgies and preaching series for regional and national worship gatherings that have been featured in The Abingdon Preaching Annual, Magnet Magazine, Worship Arts Magazine, as well as on umdiscipleship.org. His artwork has also been featured on the cover of The Upper Room.

Blessed to have a partner in life as well as in ministry, Todd and Rev. Dr. Jennifer Pick enjoy consulting, writing, and teaching about the art of worship together. They also have a 10 year-old son, Andrew, who constantly reminds them to see wonder within the ordinary! Andrew loves all God's creatures great and small (but especially orcas and sea creatures), loves to write short stories, and loves his acting classes at Casa Mañana. They can't wait to meet you and are looking forward to all God has in store as we work together to serve the Lord at St. Luke!
